About the School

The Balsillie School of International Affairs (BSIA) is an institute for advanced research, education, and outreach in the fields of global governance and international public policy.

As a hub in a global network of scholars, practitioners and students, the BSIA aims to develop new solutions to humanity's critical problems, improve global governance now and in the future, and enhance the quality of people's lives around the world.

Founded in 2007 by philanthropist Jim Balsillie, the BSIA is an equal collaboration among the Centre for International Governance Innovation (CIGI), the University of Waterloo (UW), and Wilfrid Laurier University (Laurier). The collaborating institutions bring to the BSIA different but complementary strengths, so they have different roles and responsibilities.

The two universities employ BSIA faculty and offer BSIA's academic programs, while CIGI, as a think tank, uses its in-house expertise and its worldwide network of practitioners to help inform and guide BSIA's outreach and collaborative research.

The BSIA is home to four research bodies with an international profile - the International Migration Research Centre; the Laurier Centre for Sustainable Food Systems; the MiFood Network; and the Hungry Cities Partnership.

In September 2023, the BSIA was the recipient of a \$5 million donation from the Balsillie Family Foundation for the establishment of the Technology Governance Initiative (TGI) at the School. This has resulted in the development of additional projects with a technology theme, including the Balsillie Scholars, the Balsillie Case Studies, the Balsillie Survey, and several student-focused initiatives.

The unique integration of the collaborating institutions' approaches and cultures gives the BSIA an unmatched ability to promote vigorous engagement across boundaries of discipline and practice, to connect today's experts with tomorrow's leaders in critical debate and analysis, and to achieve—in all its work—the highest standards of excellence.

Highlights of the Year

The 2023-2024 academic year was marked by great strides in growing the Balsillie School's exceptional staff team, enhancing the BSIA student experience, expanding institutional partnerships, and securing vital funding for new initiatives. It has been a year of innovation, collaboration, and excellence.

One of the most significant milestones of the year was the approval of the School's evolved five-year Strategic Plan, which followed a comprehensive mid-term evaluation of the existing plan. This five-year strategic vision will continue to guide our efforts in sustaining and strengthening the BSIA's impact on global affairs. I was also honoured to have been reappointed for a second five-year term as Director, a role I embrace with great enthusiasm and commitment to furthering the School's success.

We were deeply grateful to receive the generous \$5 million donation from Mr. Jim Balsillie, which supports the Technology Governance Initiative (TGI). An important element of our broader Strategic Plan, the TGI supports knowledge mobilization and skillset development in ways in which transformative technologies impact on society, and the implications this has for national and international policy and governance frameworks. This transformative contribution enables the BSIA to pursue excellence in international affairs and public policy through differentiation and enhances the School's value proposition to its institutional partners. Following the successful launch of the TGI, the School developed a TGI Steering Committee to advise on all new activity streams falling under the TGI: student development activities (such as paid internship experiences), the Balsillie Scholars program, the Balsillie Case Studies, and the Balsillie Survey.

Our staff team grew with the addition of Saad Hammadi and Emily Ferk, while Tiffany Bradley, Joanne Weston and Larissa Prata Varella were all recognized for their dedication and promoted to new roles. Their expertise and commitment have been instrumental in the School's continued growth and success.

We introduced several new initiatives this year aimed at enriching the BSIA experience for our community. The launch of the monthly brown bag lunch series, "What is going on in the world and what does it mean?," in collaboration with CIGI colleagues, provides a valuable platform for discussions on contemporary global issues. Additionally, the new "Coffee with the Director" program has offered an excellent opportunity for deeper engagement with students, allowing for meaningful conversations about their research and career aspirations.

The Balsillie Executive Institute also experienced notable growth, expanding its executive short courses and launching a new "Masterclass" series in National Security and Intelligence for Government officials and employees. A parallel Masterclass series in Technology Governance was also introduced specifically for BSIA students, designed to support their academic and professional development.

We were delighted to host the second annual BSIA Graduates' Reunion in Toronto, which provided a wonderful opportunity to reconnect with alumni, share the School's strategic direction, and discuss the exciting plans surrounding the Technology Governance Initiative. The strong turnout and engagement from our graduates underscore the lasting impact of BSIA's programs and community.

As ever, our faculty and students continued to make significant contributions to academic scholarship. A group of BSIA faculty and students collaborated on an edited volume titled **Managing Canadian Defence in the 2020s**, which was launched at the Royal Canadian Military Institute in Toronto. Contributors had the opportunity to present their work, showcasing the School's thought leadership in the field of defence and security.

BSIA scholars continue to receive prestigious accolades. Dr. Eric Helleiner was awarded the International Political Economy Book Prize by the International Studies Association, a testament to his influential research. We were also delighted to celebrate the achievements of our PhD students and graduates, including Allison Petrozziello, who received the Governor General's Academic Medal (Gold) and the Laurier Gold Medal of Academic Excellence (doctoral level), as well as the Dissertation Award from the International Studies Association's Human Rights section; and Burgess Langshaw Power, who was honoured with the esteemed Cadieux-Léger Fellowship—an honour granted to only one Canadian doctoral student each year.

The BSIA remains steadfast in strengthening its global reach through institutional partnerships. This year, we signed a Memorandum of Understanding with American University of Sharjah in Abu Dhabi, United Arab Emirates, as well as a partnership agreement with the University of the Western Cape in South Africa. Additionally, our collaboration with the United Nations University continued through the valuable contributions of PhD student Harry Deng, who contributed to the research and publication of a key paper for the UN's 2024 Summit of the Future.

None of these achievements would have been possible without the dedication, hard work, and vision of the BSIA community. Our faculty, fellows, staff, students, postdocs and alumni continue to inspire and elevate the School's reputation as a leader in international affairs. As we look ahead to another year of growth, collaboration, and impact, I am confident that the BSIA will continue to shape the future of global governance and scholarship. I look forward to the opportunities that the coming year will bring.

Technology Governance Initiative

“Rapid technology innovations continue to impact all areas of international affairs. Good governance and effective policy supporting these innovations are critical for national resilience, and the strength of the international system. I believe that the research expertise in Waterloo Region, led by the Balsillie School of International Affairs, will bring solutions to these challenges.” - Jim Balsillie

The BSIA was the proud recipient of a \$5 million donation from the Balsillie Family Foundation to establish the Technology Governance Initiative (TGI) at the School. The TGI at the BSIA includes the development of several new projects including:

- The **Balsillie Scholars Program**, which brings top international technology governance scholars/practitioners to the School for terms of up to one year for student/young faculty mentorship, research and collaboration. These leading scholars are immersed in the School and its activities, engaging with BSIA students, and enjoying regular interaction with like-minded networks of academic colleagues working in the area of technology governance. The School was pleased to welcome our first Balsillie Scholar, **Abdul Malek Al Jaber**, the Founder and Chairman of MENA Apps, in June 2024.
- The **Balsillie Case Studies**, a repository of true stories of contemporary technology governance challenges experienced by governmental, industrial and multilateral institutions. Prepared by domain experts, the Balsillie Case Studies series nurtures critical thinking about safety, human rights, transparency, accountability and other governance innovation to the implementation of emerging technologies. The case studies are peer-reviewed packages consisting of an evidence-based governance dilemma within an industry and a teaching note with questions to facilitate governance exercise in classrooms and workshops. The cases are discussed in a storytelling format that is accessible to readers from a multidisciplinary background. A dedicated monetized Case Study website will launch in early 2025.
- Several student-focused initiatives including: a two-week **Technology Governance Summer School**, which brought together 35 domestic and international graduate students from diverse academic backgrounds, including policy, social sciences, and STEM to provide an in- depth understanding of the technology-policy nexus – an interface which has become a critical requirement for effective policy analysis and implementation; paid **Internship Support** in technology fields, which translated into seven fully paid internships during the 2023-2024 academic year at organizations including Project Ploughshares, the Canadian Council of Innovators, and Global Affairs Canada; and an annual **Student Policy Challenge**, a two-day competition to develop the best ideas in addressing longer-term governance challenges associated with new and emerging technology. Participating student teams from BSIA and American University drew inspiration from a real-world case study and presented their proposals to a distinguished panel of judges comprising industry experts, government representatives, and faculty members.

- An annual **Balsillie Survey**, which will present data and analysis reflecting technology governance and policy-related feedback from Canada's top technology leaders, providing important empirical data and analyses for both the policy and research communities. The first survey will launch in the Fall of 2025.

Balsillie Executive Institute

Now in its third year, the Balsillie Executive Institute (BEI) continues to grow its offerings of certificate-based professional development short courses that support career-focused objectives within the wider realms of international public policy and global governance. The BEI's suite of executive courses and masterclasses features dynamic and engaging delivery led by experts at the forefront of critical and intersectional research, ensuring participants benefit from cutting-edge insights and expertise from the Institute's extensive network of affiliated research partners.

This year, the BEI delivered seven executive courses and launched its inaugural masterclass series, engaging a total of 200 participants across 141 hours of instruction. The year marked the BEI's first French offering of the 'Evidence-Based Decision Making' executive course, welcoming 20 participants from Global Affairs Canada (GAC), and the successful pilot of an in-person introductory session of the 'The New World of National Security and Intelligence Review' executive course for Ottawa-based participants.

Other highlights included the launch of a masterclass series focused on Technology Governance designed for BSIA students, which drew significant interest, with 80 students across four 3-hour masterclass sessions. The masterclasses included:

- Technology Governance: An Overview
- Demystifying Generative AI
- Computer Security and Privacy
- Introduction to Data Science

A National Security masterclass series also launched, equipping participants from various Government agencies with a critical understanding of topical issues including:

- Strengthening National Security Legislation
- Economic Security
- Foreign Interference
- Understanding the Five Eyes and Canada's Role

In May 2024, BEI introduced a 50% discounted rate for all BSIA alumni on executive courses and masterclasses, enhancing accessibility and encouraging further engagement with the Institute's innovative programming. With a website refresh during the summer, the BEI is poised for additional growth in year four.

Balsillie Papers

Launched in Spring 2020, the Balsillie Papers now include five full Volumes, each containing six papers. Utilized by policymakers and knowledge mobilizers, the Balsillie Papers translates rigorous, inter-disciplinary research into succinct articles aimed at solving humanity's most critical problems. Open to qualitative and quantitative arguments from a variety of disciplines, the aim of the Balsillie Papers is ultimately to connect policymakers with research that offers the empirical and intellectual tools needed to build, navigate, and strengthen mechanisms of national and global governance.
